5 RED FLAGS THAT MEAN IT'S TIME TO LEAVE YOUR

Ok, let's be real.

Relationships are hard.

Balancing meaningful connections with everyday life can be quite complicated – but, that doesn't mean you should ignore some serious red flags for the sake of just *being* in a relationship.
